Detailed Examination

- 3. Our Father in Heaven: What does calling God "Father" signify about our relationship with Him? How does the concept of God in heaven shape our understanding of His nature?
- 4. Hallowed Be Your Name: What does it mean for God's name to be hallowed? How can we, in our daily lives, honour and sanctify His name?
- 5. Your Kingdom Come: What is the Kingdom of God? How do we actively participate in bringing God's Kingdom to earth?
- 6. Your Will Be Done: How do we discern and follow God's will in our lives? What challenges do we face in submitting to God's will?
- 7. On Earth as It is in Heaven: What does this phrase imply about the relationship between heaven and earth? How can we contribute to making God's will a reality here and now?

Petition and Dependence

- 8. Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread: What does "daily bread" symbolise? How does this request reflect our dependence on God for our physical and spiritual needs?
- 9. Forgive Us Our Debts: Why is forgiveness central to the prayer? How does understanding God's forgiveness towards us influence our ability to forgive others?
- 10. As We Forgive Our Debtors: How does our willingness to forgive others affect our relationship with God? What practical steps can we take to cultivate a forgiving heart?

Spiritual Warfare and Protection

- **11. Lead Us Not Into Temptation**: What kinds of temptations do we face today? How can we seek God's help in resisting them?
- 12. But Deliver Us from Evil: What does this request reveal about the nature of evil and our need for God's protection? How can we stay vigilant against spiritual dangers?
